July Bike Rides

Saturday, July 4 -9:15 am "Freedom Ride" Interurban Trail. Meet at Spanky's located at 5208 W. County



Line Rd., Mequon. The pub is about 4 blocks west of Green Bay Rd. next to the railroad tracks with parking in the REAR of the lot. 





3 NIGHTS in BUDAPEST

Budapest, the capital of Hungary, is situated in central Europe, embracing the two sides of the Danube River. Explore two cities in one, because Budapest is made up of Buda and Pest, with the Danube flowing between them. Buda is built on a hill, on the western bank of the river and forms the historical part of the city. Pest stands on a plain and it is more businesslike with its shops and boulevards. We can walk between the two connected, but still very different, parts of the city on magnificent bridges.

Many sights are worth visiting, including Europe's largest Parliament building. Budapest also features great cuisine and abundant shopping.
