SAFETY TIP: Location. Location. Location. This well-known mantra of the real estate industry should also be the mantra for skiing safety. Where are you in relation to potential skiing accidents? Are you too close behind the skier who swings his or her ski pole tips while walking? Can you see over the edge of the run below you to determine whether there are injured skiers in your path? Have you protected an injured skier by crossing your skis uphill from the accident? Are you extra cautious when coming to the merger of trails when you cannot see skiers on the other trail? Do you slow down while tree skiing? Do you stop out of the way of other skiers or do you congregate in the middle of the run? When skiing to meet up with your friends, do you stop downhill from them? When you resume skiing on the hill, do you first check whether there are skiers above you, or do you just take off without looking? When riding the lift, do you remove the straps on your poles? After getting off the lift, do you get out of the way of those behind you? On easy runs are you aware of others racing down the mountain so that you stay out of their way? Do you ski in the blind spots of snow boarders or skiers? Answering these questions should remind you that you should always be aware of your surroundings, i.e., your location, and the potential pitfalls that may arise because of them.






