Your Vagabond Ski Team will begin the race season on Sunday, January 3rd, 2 giant slalom races, 4 runs total, at Alpine Valley Ski Area. Spectators are encouraged to come out and watch our team in action. A trophy presentation ceremony will be held in the bar area after the race. Our Vagabond team will be hosting this first race on January **3rd.** Any Vagabond and/or friend is invited to volunteer and come out and help. Several people have joined our Club after helping out at a Vagabond hosted race. If you are interested in volunteering, please contact me. We can always use volunteers to record and/or post times.

There are 12 races being run this winter by the Metropolitan Milwaukee Ski Council Senior Alpine Committee. The whole tentative schedule appears below. There are about 40-50 skiers at each race, and they each race in one of 11 different classes depending on gender, and skill level. Two different courses are run for each race and the times are combined. Three awards are presented for the best total times in each class at each race. Season awards are also given to the best three finishers in each

class at the end of the season. Racers don't have to go to all the races, but to qualify for a season award they must have at least 6 starts with a minimum of 2 slaloms and 2 giant slaloms.

Our Vagabond Race Team will join other MMSC clubs and have practice most Wed. nights at Little Switzerland beginning in Dec. 2015 and continuing into Feb. 2016. You will have to purchase your own lift ticket. I will give updates on the practice schedule as the time approaches, future races, location changes, cancellations, etc. If you have a doubt about a practice occurring, check your email where I will try to post late practice cancellations for our team, or phone me.

All Vagabond skiers intermediate or better are invited to try running race gates with us. Just show up and identify yourself. Skiing down a course at practice, whether starting from the top or halfway down, is a way to make local skiing exciting and fun. Try it you'll get hooked! We help each other improve our skiing, have fun, and race at an appropriate level.

We are always looking for more men and women to join us. Please consider if you know of some relative or friend that could race in the ski council. Getting people, returning or coming to our area after college, interested in ski racing is a great way to add some youth to our Club. Each year, over 300 inches of snow blankets the mountain while 300 days of sunshine create awe-inspiring slopes with 23% beginner, 36% intermediate, and 41% advanced terrain. With the addition of Revelation Bowl, Black Iron Bowl, Palmyra Peak, and Gold Hill

Chutes, several seasons ago, there are
