ADD THE WILD APRICOT APP TO YOUR SMART PHONE

No matter where you are, if you have phone service, you can register and pay for events, view a list of events you have registered for, access the online Directory, view and edit your profile and much more using your smart phone. To add the App to your phone:

- Go to the app store you use (app store, google play, etc.) Search for “**Wild Apricot – Member**” and download it.
- Open the Wild Apricot app and look at the bottom of the screen. You’ll see four icons:
- Tap “**Members**” to see the member Directory. Tap the magnifying glass to search for a specific member.
- Tap “**Event List**” to view the events being offered. Tap a specific event to register for it.
- Tap “**My Tickets**” to view a list of events you have registered for.
- Tap “**Profile**” to view your profile.

If it has been awhile since you registered for an event online or this is your first try, click the **HELP** tab on the blue ribbon at the top of each page of the Members Only website. You will find step-by-step directions explaining operations such as how to sign up for an event online, how to register two people for the same event with one payment, or sign yourself up for two events with one payment, or a variety of other online options such as adding a photo to your profile page, updating your profile and more. Time for a Helmet Safety Check*

With the end of the ski season, now is a good time to check the safety of your ski equipment.

How long does a ski helmet last? There is a no black-and-white answer as there are various factors which affect how long your ski helmet lasts. How often is your helmet used? How is it stored? How much UV damage has it sustained? Has your helmet been damaged from a fall?

If you rarely go skiing and it has not sustained any damage, your helmet will last much longer. However, if you are a regular skier, due to UV damage, it is recommended that you

replace your ski helmet after three to five ski seasons. If your helmet has any damage whatsoever, it is safest to replace your helmet immediately.

When your helmet is not in use, it needs to be stored away from any UV rays. A good spot is the bottom of a cupboard or wardrobe. You can also purchase a special helmet case that helps prevent your helmet from getting damaged when in transit or when stored.

If your helmet needs replacing, now is a great time to find a great deal at your local ski shop.


