Zermatt: The first thing you will notice about Zermatt is a remarkable lack of noise. Since 1891, the local doctor is the only person allowed to have a car in Zermatt, so everyone else travels by train. The only in-town transportation is by horse-drawn sleighs, electro-taxis and ski buses. Zermatt is a destination resort which keeps most of the weekend skiers

away. There are more than 188 miles of marked ski trails with 7,477 ft. of vertical drop. The scope and variety of Zermatt skiing is tremendous with a network of lifts serving trails that rise over 12,000 ft. Three main ski areas offer wide-open slopes for beginners while the more advanced skiers enjoy the challenge of the internationally known Tiefbach, Aeroleid or Momatt. You can ski over the Theodulpass to Cervinia, Italy, for lunch. The Klein Matterhorn cable car which ascends to 12,533 ft. (the highest cable car station in the Alps) has opened new glacier ski runs. Glacier skiing generally means off-piste but Zermatt offers eight controlled, glacial pistes totaling 11 miles of skiing. Non-skiers can enjoy sledding, curling, ice climbing, snowshoeing and

winter hiking among other activities. Also, there are a variety of train options, including the famous "Glacier Express" to explore the surrounding area. During the evening, enjoy over 180+ restaurants and 50+ bars.

Barcelona: The second most populous city in Spain, it is the capital of Catalonia and home to more than 1.6 million people. We are staying in the heart of the city, a short walk to the train and subway. We will be near Placa Reial Square, Liceu Opera House, La
