Feb. 2 – Nashotah Park: Meet at the Park & Ride Lot at Hwy 16 and Cty C at 1:30 p.m. We will shuttle in from the Park & Ride with individuals who have park permits to inside the park. Bathrooms in the park are open. Food and beverages afterward at Revere's Wells Street Tavern, 505 Wells St., Delafield. Wear proper hiking shoes. Trails of mulch, grass, gravel. Feb. 9 – Lapham Peak State Park: Take I-94 west to Hwy. C, then turn left to park entrance. Meet at the middle parking lot, which is called Homestead Hollow: type "Homestead Hollow, Delafield WI" on Google Maps. From the entrance station, go up the main road 0.7 of a mile; the parking lot is on the left. This is the area where we usually stop for bathrooms. This significantly reduces the number of hills for the hike. We will hike 5 miles, from 1:45 to 3:45 p.m., then head to Revere's Wells Street Tavern at 505 Wells St. in Delafield for chili and drinks. Hike Leader is **Betty Riley**, (262) 888-9978.

Feb. 16 – Milwaukee Lakefront: Meet at McKinley Park's parking lot (1750 N Lincoln Memorial Drive). Starting at 1:45 p.m., we will walk south to a point near the Summerfest grounds, then turn around, for a total distance of four miles.
