

Tech Tip by Linda Horn

Controlling Your Privacy on the Internet

Many of us use Google every day. It is America's most popular search engine, but it also stores a ton of our history, including websites visited and searches performed.

If you are concerned about your privacy on the internet, one thing you can do is to regulate how much information Google stores about you. Google provides three simple ways that you can delete your history: 1. Manually, item by item; 2. By date; and 3. Automatically.

How to Delete Your Google History Automatically

- ❶ Go to MyAccount.google.com and sign in.
- ❷ Click on **Privacy & personalization.**
- ❸ Click on **Data & Privacy.**
- ❹ Scroll down and click **Web & App Activity.**
- ❺ Click on **Auto-delete.**

You should see a pop-up box that shows you the options to automatically delete your Google activity older than 3, 18 and 36 months.

Here's what that looks like:



When you decide which timeframe of data you want to remove, click **Next** and **Confirm** to save your choice.
