What's next? You decide

The club continues its search for a Ski Activities Director. Directors serve a two-year term. Without someone willing to step up, your club will not be able to continue ski trips. This is a position that requires an extensive level of time and commitment all year long.

Last month, we outlined many of the duties assigned to the next Ski Activities Director. We repeat them here: writing articles for the monthly newsletter; attending the monthly board and general meetings; researching ski locations, lodging and transportation options as well as pricing out the trips and developing a budget for each trip. A working knowledge of Excel helps with this. The director develops marketing materials for each trip (knowledge of Word is a plus) and needs to be proficient (or willing to learn) the club management tool (Wild Apricot). Wild Apricot is required to set up trips and to communicate directly to those interested in skiing.

If someone doesn't volunteer to run by the time of the May election, the club will have to reduce the number of ski trips or even eliminate them altogether.

Additionally, the club needs trip leaders for individual trips. Trip leaders need to know (or be willing to learn) Wild Apricot. A trip leader keeps track of registrants and their payments, communicates details about the trip, completes airline registers, sets up social events during the trip and ensures that the budget is respected. Additionally, the trip leader is the liaison for bus transportation and lodging.
